But I never run from challenges because that's how I grow. If I don't give back to others what was so freely was given to me that is selfish.

The diversity of our fellowship that I see at our assemblies and the dedication and amount of recovery time that flows through service shows me what the big picture is all about and why and how this program works.

Right now, I am the GSR for the Oviedo women's group. I don't know yet what other positions will find me. Sue is my service sponsor, and I can't conceive of someone who would be remotely better. For crying out loud she is our DCM!

I will sound like a broken record, but it is true, that with my sponsor's love and kindness in guiding me is how I am where I am today. She has made me a better person. I strive to follow her examples because she teaches me humility, patience, and how important service of any sort is not only for myself, but for our fellowship.
